

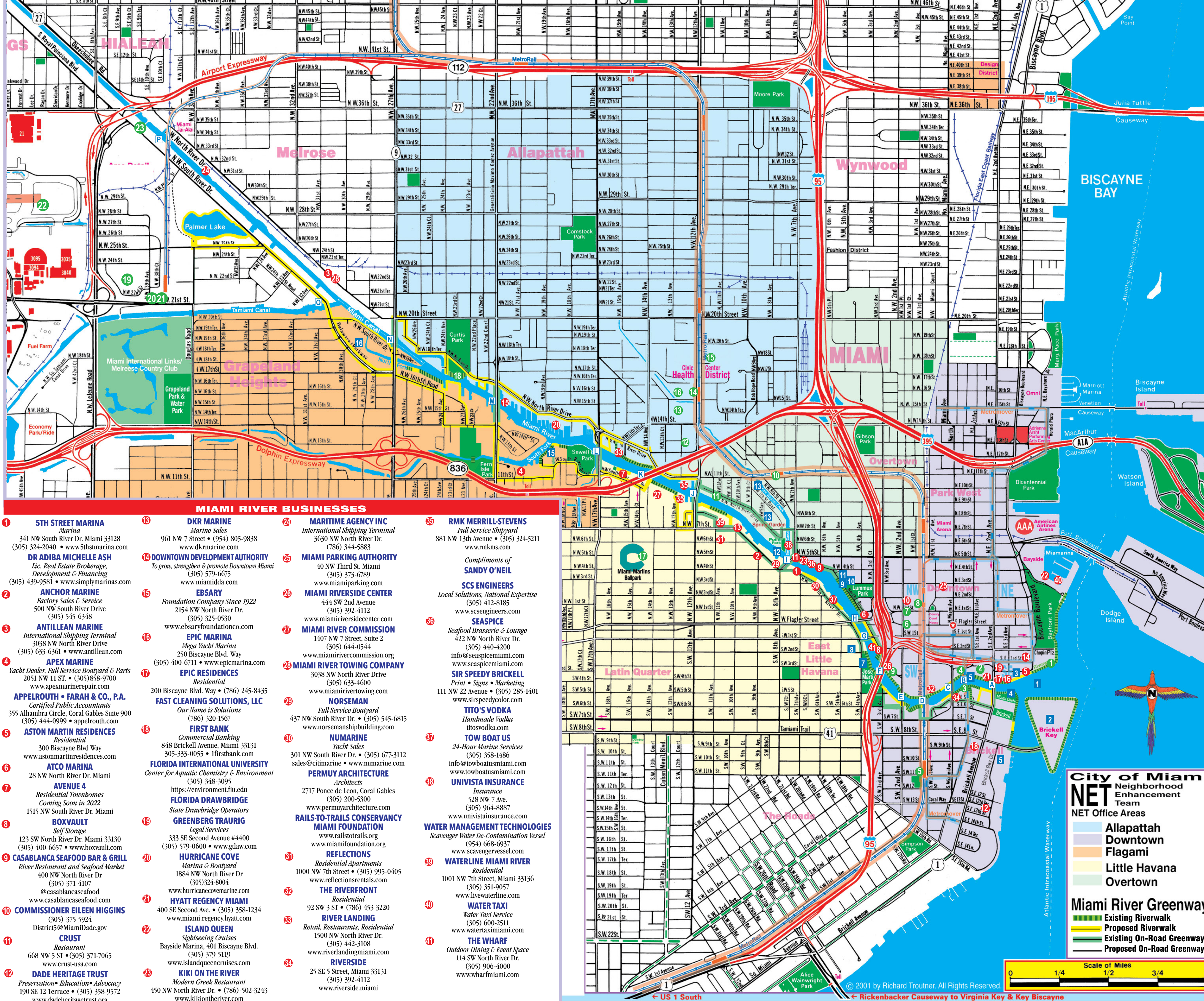

**THE HISTORIC MIAMI RIVER**  
1910 the Miami River was central to the birth of the City of Miami. Until World War I, Miami River was the city's main source of drinking water. The ongoing employment by constructing 30 similar houses along what is now SE 1st and 2nd and Street, between SE 1st and 2nd Avenues. This frame vernacular style "Royal Palm Cottage", was constructed in 1897 from native pine with a gabled, shingled roof. The one remaining is the only structure of its age, size and type in downtown Miami. It has been moved to Fort Dallas Park on the Miami River. The City Commission designated the Flagler Workers House a historic site in 1983.

1896 Henry Flagler, owner of Florida East Coast Railroad and Florida East Coast Hotel, built the Royal Palm Hotel. The luxurious hotel was Miami's first major tourist accommodation.

A 2,000-year-old stone circle was discovered during a mandatory archaeological survey of the site when two residential buildings were planned for construction. The south bank of the Miami River's mouth was a Tequesta tribe village circa 750 B.C.

The State of Florida, Florida Inland Navigation District, South Florida Water Management District, City of Miami and the Downtown Development Authority completed replacement of the site's original development plan in 2009. In 2009 an archaeological survey discovered the remains of the Tequesta Tribe burial ground in Brickell Park.

**WAGNER HOMESTEAD**  
This pre-1858 structure is the county's oldest standing house. It was built by William Wagner, an 1855 pioneer, whose homestead included a coonite mill and Miami's small wooden church, which burned down in 1892.

The Dade County pine house is hand-hewn, peg fastened and wood-shingled example of mid-19th century shanties.

Development in the 1920s prompted its donation to the Dade Heritage Trust, a preservation group who undertook relocation and restoration. The City Commission designated the Wagner Homestead a historic site in 1984.

**RIVER INN MIAMI**  
The River Inn Miami was constructed in 1906. Sallye Judd, restored the historic inn in the late 1980's. The active historical Miami River Hotel is on an 1855 pioneer, whose homestead included a coonite mill and Miami's small wooden church, which burned down in 1892.

The Dade County pine house is hand-hewn, peg fastened and wood-shingled example of mid-19th century shanties.

Development in the 1920s prompted its donation to the Dade Heritage Trust, a preservation group who undertook relocation and restoration. The City Commission designated the Wagner Homestead a historic site in 1984.

**SCOTTISH RITE TEMPLE**  
This 1922 building was designed and built by architect Kiehnel and Elliot. Egyptian inspired temple is noteworthy for combining classical detail with Art Deco abstraction in elements such as two-headed eagles and a zigzag roof. The original and present owner is the Miami Scottish Rite Temple Association. The City of Miami recently included this property within the designated Lumus Park Historic District.

**COPPINGER'S VILLAGE**  
Florida's first commercial Seminole Tribe village was Copinger's Tropical Gardens, Alligator Farm and Seminole Tribe Village. It opened in 1917 on land bought in 1911 by Henry Copinger, Sr. as a botanical showcase. Seminoles camping on the grounds were encouraged to stay. More chickens were added and the area opened to tourists to provide income, food and medical attention for the Seminoles. Henry, Jr. willed alligators with the Seminoles.

**HINDU TEMPLE**  
In 1919 "The Jungle Trail" motion picture was filmed in Spring Garden. When the Hindu Temple movie set was removed after the filming completed, John Seybold, the owner of the Spring Garden subdivision, hired August Geiger (famous Miami architect who designed the City Hospital) to develop a partial residence in the style of the Hindu Temple set. The residence is on the National Register of Historic Buildings.

**SPRING GARDEN**  
Spring Garden was formed as a subdivision in 1919. It is home to an eclectic collection of artists and professionals. Its early residents included Miami Herald editor Frank Stoneman as well as his daughter Marjorie Stoneman Douglas. Miami baker John Seybold, and several doctors, lawyers and businessmen. Spring Garden was designated a historic neighborhood by the City Commission in 1997.

**FLAGLER WORKERS HOUSE**  
Henry Flagler arrived in the late 1800s to build the railroad, the Royal Palm Hotel and other developments. When the hotel was built, the ongoing employment by constructing 30 similar houses along what is now SE 1st and 2nd and Avenues. This frame vernacular style "Royal Palm Cottage", was constructed in 1897 from native pine with a gabled, shingled roof. The one remaining is the only structure of its age, size and type in downtown Miami. It has been moved to Fort Dallas Park on the Miami River. The City Commission designated the Flagler Workers House a historic site in 1983.

**BRICKELL PARK**  
Brickell Park is named after one of Miami's founders, Mary Brickell. In 1871 the Brickell family had a home on this location, and owned the first trading post in Miami. In 2009 an archaeological survey discovered the remains of the Tequesta Tribe burial ground in Brickell Park.

**MIAMI CIRCLE**  
A 2,000-year-old stone circle was discovered during a mandatory archaeological survey of the site when two residential buildings were planned for construction. The south bank of the Miami River's mouth was a Tequesta tribe village circa 750 B.C.

**ROYAL PALM HOTEL**  
In 1896 Henry Flagler, owner of Florida East Coast Railroad and Florida East Coast Hotel, built the Royal Palm Hotel. The luxurious hotel was Miami's first major tourist accommodation.
